spcaLA and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Partner to Offer Free Pet Vaccinations

Los Angeles – Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Los Angeles (spcaLA) and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health set up a free, temporary vaccine clinic for pets of the homeless and others in need in Downtown Los Angeles' Skid Row yesterday in an effort to improve the health and safety of pets in the area.

Despite the rain, pet companions lined-up for free vaccines, deworming, and flea treatment administered by spcaLA and LA County Public Health veterinarians. spcaLA staff and volunteers gave participants free pet food, dog toys, leads and collars.

Plans are underway for another free downtown vaccine clinic sometime early next year.
