## Trick Training at spcaLA



**Thank you for signing up with spcaLA!** spcaLA specialty classes are held at the **spcaLA P.D. Pitchford Companion Animal Village & Education Center** in Long Beach (7700 E. Spring Street – inside El Dorado Park).

- Please bring your dog to class on a secure collar and lead.
- Bring the following items to class (most are available for purchase at the spcaLA Marketplace):
  - A LOT of yummy, stinky training treats. It is best if your dog is a little hungry try to schedule dinner for after class.
  - A treat bag or pouch (you will need both hands for most exercises)
  - A "clicker" training tool
  - A mouse pad
  - A wooden spoon
  - A Martingale® or flat buckle collar
  - Your dog's MOST FAVORITE TOY
- Be sure to bring poop bags! spcaLA does not provide them.
- Please note, we don't allow play time or visits between dogs.
- Wear comfortable, rubber-soled, closed-toe shoes during class. Even when the weather is warm, please do not wear flip-flops or sandals.
- Bring water for yourself and your dog.
- Plan to bring a sweater or light jacket for you—the temperature can shift quickly when the sun sets.
- Before, during and after your class, there are other classes in session around the property. Please be respectful of all students, instructors and class working areas. If you or guests are disruptive or do not follow spcaLA guidelines, you may be asked to leave class and no refunds will be issued.
- Human guests are welcome to observe class please contact us at **training@spcaLA.com** in advance as your guest must complete a liability waiver.

Please do not plan to use pinch collars, choke chains, electric (remote) collars or flexi-leads during training exercises.

Please be on time to class. In deference to other students, those who arrive 10 minutes late to class will not be admitted and will be marked as absent.

If you have not done so already, please provide spcaLA with your dog's current vaccination records. Dogs must be current on Rabies, DHPP (or equivalent) and Bordetella vaccines and be in good general health.
