Eyes closed, ears folded, can't stand. Bright pink noses and paw pads. Require total care including feeding, warmth, and waste elimination.



Eyes opening, ears unfolding. Able to hold head up and move around. Sleep majority of day and begin to purr.



Eyes and ears open. Eyes will appear blue. Kittens begin to interact with each other and are still nursing.



Walking, exploring, playing with littermates. Can eliminate on their own. Litterbox and wet kitten food can be introduced.



Four Weeks

Playing with each other, toys, and humans. Transitioning to normal diet.



Six Weeks

Playing, grooming themselves, using litterbox. Eating on their own. Developing personality, socialization is key.



Eyes are permanent color. Playful, coordinated movements, adventurous. At 2lbs, can be spayed/neutered.
